He published an autobiographical book *Down and Out in London and Paris*, with Victor Gollancz Ltd. under his pen name of George Orwell. This established his literary career. Orwell was a prolific journalist, essayist, novelist and nonfiction writer. He is remembered for his prescient writing and his unwavering commitment to truth and clarity of expression. Orwell suggested the title *Union des républiques socialistes animales* for the French translation, which abbreviates to *URSA*, the Latin word for bear, a symbol of Russia. It also played on the French name of the Soviet Union, *Union des républiques socialistes soviétiques*. Orwell wrote the book between November 1943 and February 1944, when the United Kingdom was in its wartime alliance with the Soviet Union against Nazi Germany, and the British intelligentsia held Stalin in high esteem, a phenomenon Orwell hated. The manuscript was initially rejected by a number of British and American publishers, including one of Orwell's own, Victor Gollancz, which delayed its publication. It became a great commercial success when it did appear partly because international relations were transformed as the wartime alliance gave way to the Cold War. *Time* magazine chose the book as one of the 100 best English-language novels (1923 to 2005); it also featured at number 31 on the Modern Library List of Best 20th-Century Novels, and number 46 on the BBC's *The Big Read* poll. It won a Retrospective Hugo Award in 1996 and is included in the Great Books of the Western World selection.

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
