START WITH FAMILIAR WORDS

- **ADJECTIVES:** "BIG," "RED," "HOT."

PHONETIC AND ORTHOGRAPHIC FEATURES

PHONETICALLY, THREE-LETTER WORDS ARE OFTEN SIMPLE, FEATURING ONE SYLLABLE. THIS CHARACTERISTIC FACILITATES EASIER PRONUNCIATION AND FASTER PROCESSING DURING COMMUNICATION. SKILLED COMMUNICATORS OFTEN INTEGRATE THESE WORDS WITH LONGER, MORE DESCRIPTIVE TERMS TO MAINTAIN READER ENGAGEMENT AND CONVEY DETAILED INFORMATION.
