THE 1948 ARAB-ISRAELI WAR AND NAKBA

THE END OF THE BRITISH MANDATE AND THE UNITED NATIONS' PLAN TO PARTITION PALESTINE INTO SEPARATE JEWISH AND ARAB STATES SPARKED A MAJOR CONFLICT. THE DECLARATION OF THE STATE OF ISRAEL IN 1948 WAS FOLLOWED BY WAR INVOLVING NEIGHBORING ARAB COUNTRIES. FOR PALESTINIANS, THIS EVENT IS REMEMBERED AS THE NAKBA, OR "CATASTROPHE," MARKING THE DISPLACEMENT OF HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS AND THE LOSS OF THEIR HOMELAND.

LATE 20TH CENTURY TO PRESENT: STRUGGLE AND STATEHOOD EFFORTS

THE 1967 SIX-DAY WAR AND OCCUPATION

THE SELEUCID AND PTOLEMAIC DYNASTIES VIED FOR CONTROL UNTIL THE EMERGENCE OF THE HASMONEAN DYNASTY, WHICH REASSERTED JEWISH AUTONOMY BRIEFLY IN THE 2ND CENTURY BCE.

ROMAN AND BYZANTINE RULE

THE ROMAN EMPIRE INCORPORATED PALESTINE IN 63 BCE, INITIATING A PERIOD MARKED BY SIGNIFICANT URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND CULTURAL BLENDING BUT ALSO BY SOCIAL AND RELIGIOUS TENSIONS. DURING THE BYZANTINE PERIOD (4TH TO 7TH CENTURIES CE), PALESTINE REMAINED A CRUCIAL CHRISTIAN CENTER. CITIES LIKE JERUSALEM FLOURISHED AS RELIGIOUS PILGRIMAGE SITES, AND NUMEROUS CHURCHES AND MONASTERIES WERE ESTABLISHED. HOWEVER, THE REGION WAS ALSO A FRONTIER ZONE VULNERABLE TO EXTERNAL INVASIONS.

ISLAMIC CONQUEST AND MEDIEVAL PERIOD

PEACE INITIATIVES SUCH AS THE OSLO ACCORDS IN THE 1990S SOUGHT TO ESTABLISH A FRAMEWORK FOR RESOLVING THE CONFLICT, BUT PERSISTENT DISAGREEMENTS AND OUTBREAKS OF VIOLENCE HAVE HINDERED LASTING SOLUTIONS.
