INTERESTINGLY, REGNEY WROTE THE LYRICS IN THE FORM OF A DIALOGUE, STARTING WITH A NARRATOR ASKING, "DO YOU HEAR WHAT I HEAR?" THIS CONVERSATIONAL STYLE MADE THE SONG FEEL INTIMATE AND ENGAGING, INVITING LISTENERS TO JOIN IN THE UNFOLDING STORY.

GLORIA SHAYNE BAKER'S MELODY WAS GENTLE AND HAUNTING, PERFECTLY MATCHING THE LYRICS' PEACEFUL PLEA. THE SONG'S STRUCTURE, WITH ITS BUILDING INTENSITY AND REPEATING QUESTIONS, CREATES A SENSE OF ANTICIPATION AND HOPE, WHICH HELPED IT STAND OUT AMONG TRADITIONAL CHRISTMAS CAROLS.

- **THE KING:** WHO HEARS THE NEWS AND IS CALLED TO “BRING HIM SILVER AND GOLD.”

EACH VOICE ADDS A LAYER TO THE SONG’S MESSAGE, MOVING FROM THE NATURAL WORLD TO HUMAN AUTHORITY, REFLECTING THE SPREADING OF HOPE AND GOOD NEWS. THIS STORYTELLING METHOD CONNECTS THE SONG TO TRADITIONAL CHRISTMAS NARRATIVES WHILE ADDING A UNIVERSAL APPEAL.

SYMBOLISM OF PEACE AND HOPE

UNDERSTANDING THE BACKGROUNDS OF THE CREATORS ENRICHES THE NARRATIVE OF "DO YOU HEAR WHAT I HEAR?" NOËL REGNEY, BORN LEON SCHLIENGER IN FRANCE, SURVIVED THE HORRORS OF WAR WHICH LEFT AN INDELIBLE IMPACT ON HIS WORLDVIEW. HIS WIFE, GLORIA SHAYNE BAKER, WAS A TALENTED AMERICAN COMPOSER AND PIANIST. TOGETHER, THEY MERGED THEIR ARTISTIC TALENTS AND PERSONAL CONVICTIONS TO PRODUCE A SONG THAT TRANSCENDED TYPICAL HOLIDAY CHEER.

INTERESTINGLY, REGNEY ORIGINALLY WROTE THE LYRICS FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF THE NARRATOR, IMAGINING THE STORY IN REVERSE CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER—STARTING FROM THE SHEPHERD AND MOVING BACK TO THE CHILD. THIS UNIQUE APPROACH GAVE THE SONG A POETIC AND REFLECTIVE QUALITY, DISTINGUISHING IT FROM TRADITIONAL CHRISTMAS CAROLS.

THE LYRICS AND THEIR SYMBOLISM

AT THE HEART OF DO YOU HEAR WHAT I HEAR HISTORY LIES THE SONG'S NARRATIVE, WHICH UNFOLDS THROUGH A SERIES OF CONVERSATIONS BETWEEN VARIOUS CHARACTERS: THE NIGHT WIND, A SHEPHERD BOY, A LAMB, AND A KING.
