Hans-Georg Gadamer is one of the foremost European philosophers of recent times. His work on philosophical hermeneutics defined the whole subject, and *Truth and Method*, his magnum opus, is a landmark text in modern philosophy. The book also discusses Gadamer's influence in other areas of philosophy; the response of other philosophers to his work; and criticisms of his work on the grounds of relativism.
