THIS SENSITIVITY PROVES THAT SHE IS INDEED A REAL PRINCESS, AS ONLY SOMEONE OF TRUE ROYAL BLOOD COULD FEEL A TINY PEA BENEATH SO MANY LAYERS. THE PRINCE AND PRINCESS MARRY, AND THE STORY ENDS HAPPILY EVER AFTER.

THE DEEPER MEANING BEHIND THE TALE

WHILE THE PRINCESS AND THE PEA FAIRY TALE MIGHT APPEAR TO BE A LIGHTHEARTED CHILDREN'S STORY, IT OFFERS SOME INTRIGUING REFLECTIONS ON SOCIAL CLASS, IDENTITY, AND SENSITIVITY.
