IDA B. WELLS, BORN INTO SLAVERY SHORTLY BEFORE THE CIVIL WAR, GREW UP WITNESSING THE HARSH REALITIES OF RACIAL DISCRIMINATION. AS A JOURNALIST, SHE USED HER PEN AS A WEAPON TO CHALLENGE THE MYTHS AND LIES PERPETUATED ABOUT AFRICAN AMERICANS, ESPECIALLY THE FALSE ACCUSATIONS USED TO JUSTIFY LYNCHING. HER COMMITMENT TO TRUTH AND JUSTICE PROPELLED HER TO INVESTIGATE AND DOCUMENT LYNCHING CASES, CULMINATING IN THE PUBLICATION OF THE RED RECORD IN 1895.

WHAT IS THE RED RECORD?

THE RED RECORD IS ESSENTIALLY A METICULOUSLY RESEARCHED PAMPHLET THAT COMPILES STATISTICS, CASE STUDIES, AND PERSONAL ACCOUNTS OF LYNCHINGS ACROSS THE UNITED STATES, FOCUSING PRIMARILY ON THE YEARS BETWEEN 1892 AND 1894. UNLIKE MANY SENSATIONALIZED REPORTS OF THE TIME, WELLS' WORK PRESENTED COLD, HARD FACTS THAT CONTRADICTED THE COMMON NARRATIVE THAT LYNCHINGS WERE JUSTIFIED PUNISHMENTS FOR CRIMES COMMITTED BY BLACK MEN.

THROUGH THE RED RECORD, WELLS ARGUED THAT LYNCHING WAS OFTEN MOTIVATED BY RACIAL HATRED, ECONOMIC COMPETITION, AND THE DESIRE TO SUPPRESS BLACK UPLIFT RATHER THAN ACTUAL CRIMINAL GUILT. SHE CHALLENGED THE WIDESPREAD BELIEF THAT LYNCHINGS WERE RESPONSES TO BLACK MEN ASSAULTING WHITE WOMEN, REVEALING THAT MANY VICTIMS WERE INNOCENT OR ACCUSED OF NONVIOLENT OFFENSES.

IDA B. WELLS' INVESTIGATIVE APPROACH AND COURAGE

ONE OF THE MOST STRIKING ASPECTS OF THE RED RECORD IS THE INVESTIGATIVE RIGOR AND COURAGE IDA B. WELLS DEMONSTRATED WHILE COMPILING THE DATA. AT A TIME WHEN SPEAKING OUT AGAINST LYNCHING PUT HER OWN LIFE AT RISK, WELLS TRAVELED EXTENSIVELY IN THE SOUTH, INTERVIEWED WITNESSES, AND GATHERED EVIDENCE TO EXPOSE THE TRUTH.

HER FEARLESS REPORTING OFTEN MADE HER A TARGET. AFTER PUBLISHING AN EDITORIAL CONDEMNING A LYNCHING IN MEMPHIS, WELLS' NEWSPAPER OFFICE WAS DESTROYED BY A MOB, AND SHE WAS FORCED TO FLEE FOR HER SAFETY. DESPITE THIS, HER DETERMINATION DID NOT WAVER, AND THE RED RECORD BECAME A CRITICAL TOOL IN THE EARLY ANTI-LYNCHING MOVEMENT,

HELPING TO RAISE NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL AWARENESS.

THE RED RECORD'S KEY FINDINGS

THE PAMPHLET PROVIDES A SOBERING ACCOUNT OF THE SCALE AND NATURE OF LYNCHING IN AMERICA DURING THAT ERA. SOME OF THE KEY FINDINGS INCLUDE:

She married Ferdinand L. Barnett in 1895 and had a family while continuing her work writing, speaking, and organizing for civil rights and the women's movement for the rest of her life.
