THIS INTERNALIZED INFERIORITY COMPLEX AFFECTS SELF-ESTEEM AND HINDERS THE CELEBRATION OF AFRICAN IDENTITY.

THE HISTORICAL ROOTS OF COLONIAL MENTALITY IN AFRICA

TO FULLY GRASP THE COLONIAL MENTALITY IN AFRICA, ONE MUST APPRECIATE THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT. COLONIZATION WAS NOT JUST ABOUT TERRITORIAL CONTROL BUT ALSO PSYCHOLOGICAL DOMINATION. EUROPEAN POWERS IMPOSED THEIR LANGUAGES, RELIGIONS, AND CULTURAL NORMS, OFTEN DEMONIZING INDIGENOUS PRACTICES.

NKUZI MICHAEL NNAM POINTS OUT THAT AFRICAN EDUCATION SYSTEMS WERE DESIGNED TO PRODUCE CLERKS AND SUBORDINATES LOYAL TO COLONIAL ADMINISTRATIONS RATHER THAN INDEPENDENT THINKERS OR CULTURAL CUSTODIANS. HOW COLONIAL MENTALITY AFFECTS AFRICAN SOCIETIES TODAY

THE RIPPLE EFFECTS OF COLONIAL MENTALITY ARE STILL EVIDENT IN VARIOUS ASPECTS OF AFRICAN LIFE. FROM LANGUAGE PREFERENCES TO CONSUMER HABITS, MANY AFRICANS CONTINUE TO PRIORITIZE WESTERN NORMS.

FOR INSTANCE:

- ****LANGUAGE PREFERENCE:**** MANY AFRICAN COUNTRIES MAINTAIN COLONIAL LANGUAGES (ENGLISH, FRENCH, PORTUGUESE) AS OFFICIAL LANGUAGES, SOMETIMES AT THE EXPENSE OF LOCAL DIALECTS.
- ****BEAUTY STANDARDS:**** THERE IS A WIDESPREAD PREFERENCE FOR LIGHTER SKIN TONES, STRAIGHTER HAIR, AND WESTERN FASHION, FUELED BY GLOBAL MEDIA AND ADVERTISING.
- ****EDUCATIONAL ASPIRATIONS:**** WESTERN EDUCATION SYSTEMS ARE OFTEN SEEN AS SUPERIOR, LEADING TO BRAIN DRAIN AND NEGLECT OF INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE SYSTEMS.

NKUZI MICHAEL NNAM WARNS THAT THIS MINDSET UNDERMINES EFFORTS TO BUILD A TRULY INDEPENDENT AFRICAN IDENTITY AND CAN PERPETUATE ECONOMIC AND CULTURAL DEPENDENCY.

RECLAIMING AFRICAN IDENTITY: PERSPECTIVES FROM NKUZI MICHAEL NNAM

ONE OF THE MOST COMPELLING ASPECTS OF NKUZI MICHAEL NNAM'S WORK IS HIS CALL FOR AFRICANS TO CRITICALLY EXAMINE AND REJECT COLONIAL MENTALITY. HE ADVOCATES FOR A CONSCIOUS REVIVAL OF AFRICAN LANGUAGES, TRADITIONS, AND PHILOSOPHIES AS FOUNDATIONS FOR DEVELOPMENT AND SELF-WORTH.

BY QUESTIONING THE SOURCES AND IMPACTS OF WESTERN BEAUTY IDEALS, AFRICANS CAN BEGIN TO CELEBRATE DIVERSE EXPRESSIONS OF BEAUTY ROOTED IN THEIR OWN CULTURES. NNAM ENCOURAGES MEDIA REPRESENTATION THAT HIGHLIGHTS AFRICAN AESTHETICS AND STORIES, FOSTERING A POSITIVE SELF-IMAGE AMONG THE YOUTH.

PROMOTING AFROCENTRIC EDUCATION AND SCHOLARSHIP

NKUZI MICHAEL NNAM STRESSES THE IMPORTANCE OF DEVELOPING CURRICULA THAT INTEGRATE AFRICAN HISTORY, PHILOSOPHY, AND SCIENCE. SUCH EDUCATIONAL REFORMS WOULD EMPOWER STUDENTS TO APPRECIATE THEIR ROOTS AND CONTRIBUTE UNIQUELY TO GLOBAL KNOWLEDGE WITHOUT FEELING INFERIOR.

THE DISCOURSE ON COLONIAL MENTALITY IN AFRICA, AS EXPLORED BY Nnam, INVITES A NUANCED UNDERSTANDING BEYOND THE SIMPLISTIC NOTION OF COLONIALISM AS A HISTORICAL EVENT. INSTEAD, IT EXAMINES THE PSYCHOLOGICAL AND INSTITUTIONAL CONTINUITIES THAT MANIFEST IN VARIOUS FACETS OF AFRICAN LIFE, OFTEN CHALLENGING THE CONTINENT'S EFFORTS TOWARDS AUTHENTIC SELF-DETERMINATION AND CULTURAL RENAISSANCE.

DEFINING COLONIAL MENTALITY IN THE AFRICAN CONTEXT

COLONIAL MENTALITY BROADLY REFERS TO THE INTERNALIZED ATTITUDE OF ETHNIC OR CULTURAL INFERIORITY FELT BY PEOPLE AS A RESULT OF COLONIZATION. Nkuzi Michael Nnam HIGHLIGHTS THAT SUCH A MENTALITY IS NOT MERELY AN INDIVIDUAL PSYCHOLOGICAL ISSUE BUT A SYSTEMIC PROBLEM EMBEDDED WITHIN EDUCATION, MEDIA, AND GOVERNANCE FRAMEWORKS ESTABLISHED DURING COLONIAL RULE AND PERPETUATED POST-INDEPENDENCE.

THE COLONIAL PROJECT WAS NOT ONLY TERRITORIAL CONQUEST BUT ALSO AN IDEOLOGICAL IMPOSITION THAT DEVALUED AFRICAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEMS AND CULTURAL IDENTITIES. HISTORICAL ROOTS AND PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPLICATIONS

Nnam TRACES THE ORIGINS OF COLONIAL MENTALITY TO THE COLONIAL EDUCATION SYSTEMS THAT PRIORITIZED EUROPEAN HISTORY, LANGUAGES, AND WORLDVIEWS, RELEGATING AFRICAN HISTORIES AND EPISTEMOLOGIES TO THE MARGINS. THIS EDUCATIONAL BIAS CULTIVATED A PERCEPTION AMONG MANY AFRICANS THAT EUROPEAN WAYS WERE SUPERIOR AND MORE CIVILIZED. CONSEQUENTLY, A PSYCHOLOGICAL DEPENDENCY EMERGED, OFTEN TERMED "CULTURAL ALIENATION," WHICH SHAPES IDENTITY CRISES AND SOCIETAL ASPIRATIONS.

THE PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPLICATIONS OF THIS PHENOMENON INCLUDE:

- SELF-DOUBT REGARDING AFRICAN CULTURAL HERITAGE AND VALUES.
- PREFERENCE FOR FOREIGN GOODS, LANGUAGES, AND LIFESTYLES.
- RESISTANCE OR SKEPTICISM TOWARDS INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE AND GOVERNANCE STRUCTURES.

Nkuzi Michael Nnam ARGUES THAT THESE PSYCHOLOGICAL SCARS HINDER AFRICA'S ABILITY TO HARNESS ITS CULTURAL ASSETS FULLY AND INNOVATE SOLUTIONS ROOTED IN INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE.

MANIFESTATIONS OF COLONIAL MENTALITY IN CONTEMPORARY AFRICA

DESPITE THE FORMAL END OF COLONIAL RULE, COLONIAL MENTALITY PERSISTS IN VARIOUS SPHERES. Nnam'S ANALYSIS SHEDS LIGHT ON HOW THIS ENDURING MINDSET INFLUENCES POLITICS, EDUCATION, AND ECONOMICS.

POLITICAL STRUCTURES AND GOVERNANCE

POST-INDEPENDENCE AFRICAN STATES OFTEN INHERITED GOVERNANCE SYSTEMS MODELED ON COLONIAL ADMINISTRATIONS. Nnam CRITIQUES THE ADOPTION AND CONTINUED RELIANCE ON THESE FOREIGN POLITICAL FRAMEWORKS, WHICH SOMETIMES CLASH WITH PRE-COLONIAL SOCIO-POLITICAL ORGANIZATIONS. THE COLONIAL MENTALITY MANIFESTS IN:

- PREFERENCE FOR WESTERN-STYLE DEMOCRACY WITHOUT ADAPTING TO LOCAL CONTEXTS.
- ELITE POLITICAL CLASSES EDUCATED ABROAD WHO PRIORITIZE WESTERN POLITICAL NORMS.
- NEGLECT OF TRADITIONAL LEADERSHIP SYSTEMS AND INDIGENOUS CONFLICT RESOLUTION MECHANISMS.

THIS PHENOMENON CONTRIBUTES TO GOVERNANCE CHALLENGES, INCLUDING POLITICAL INSTABILITY AND LACK OF AUTHENTIC REPRESENTATION.

LANGUAGE AND EDUCATION

LANGUAGE IS A KEY BATTLEGROUND WHERE COLONIAL MENTALITY IS EVIDENT. Nnam POINTS OUT THAT MANY AFRICAN COUNTRIES CONTINUE TO USE COLONIAL LANGUAGES LIKE ENGLISH, FRENCH, AND PORTUGUESE AS OFFICIAL LANGUAGES, OFTEN AT THE EXPENSE OF LOCAL LANGUAGES. THIS PRACTICE REINFORCES THE NOTION THAT COLONIAL LANGUAGES ARE SUPERIOR AND NECESSARY FOR SOCIAL MOBILITY AND ECONOMIC SUCCESS.

IN EDUCATION, CURRICULA OFTEN EMPHASIZE WESTERN HISTORY AND SCIENTIFIC PARADIGMS, SIDELINING AFRICAN CONTRIBUTIONS AND KNOWLEDGE. THIS PERPETUATES THE CYCLE OF CULTURAL ALIENATION AND INHIBITS THE DEVELOPMENT OF EDUCATIONAL MODELS GROUNDED IN AFRICAN REALITIES.

ECONOMIC PREFERENCES AND CONSUMER BEHAVIOR

THE ECONOMIC DIMENSION OF COLONIAL MENTALITY IS VISIBLE IN CONSUMER PREFERENCES AND BUSINESS PRACTICES. SIMILARLY, AFRICAN ENTREPRENEURS SOMETIMES UNDERVALUE INDIGENOUS BUSINESS MODELS AND TRADITIONAL ECONOMIC PRACTICES, OPTING INSTEAD TO MIMIC WESTERN STYLES AND STANDARDS, WHICH MAY NOT ALWAYS BE SUITED TO LOCAL CONTEXTS.

I propose to take Fanon at his word and to return to the dialectic as subjective thought rather than as motion of history; as a specific political subjectivity rather than as an objective development. Dialectical thought should be considered as the core feature of any politics of emancipation, a politics that is founded on what is common to humanity, an egalitarian alternative to the existing neocolonial racist capitalist organisation of society. This book seeks to outline and assess the thinking of emancipatory politics in Africa as it changed in different historical periods. It also contrasts such politics to state political subjectivities which, by their very nature, reproduce given social placements or stated differently the allocation of people to hierarchical locations in society. Emancipatory politics always affirms a rejection of the place allocated to the oppressed and therefore contradicts and transcends the regular state subjectivities embodied in culture which ultimately attempt to justify such placement. Emancipatory politics is exceptional and therefore rare, and it is dialectical because it combines in a contradictory manner the culture of placement from which it emanates with the idea of universal freedom. Dialectics is not the affirmation of historical necessity; it is a subjective political possibility opposed to (neo)colonial capitalism which has relegated the majority of our population to conditions of perennial impoverishment, oppression and gradual alienation from any Idea of being Human. This work illustrates the fact that dialectical thought has existed in Africa over millennia, with its earliest manifestation being in Ancient Egypt. The text also draws on the universalist content of African proverbs to show the possible dialectical content of African modes of thought, illustrating the

emancipatory potential already in existence in some African cultures. The contemporary attempts at achieving freedom on the African continent - the liberation struggles of the twentieth century - failed fundamentally because they rapidly abandoned any idea of universal humanity and held that emancipation was to be achieved through the medium of the state. It was the desire of the oligarchy that inherited independence to be accepted and integrated into the global capitalist economy for the purposes of state-led 'development'. The effect, after a short nationalist interlude, was not an inclusive form of 'nation-building' but rather the building of a neocolonial state by a Western-oriented oligarchy unable or unwilling to meet the basic needs of its own people. To succeed in this endeavour, the newly independent state retained many oppressive features of its colonial predecessor remoulding them to suit its needs. The book shows how in an overwhelmingly neocolonial context, it is of little consequence to the oppressed masses in Africa whether their political system is formally labelled as 'democratic' or not. In fact, given the endemic corruption among the oligarchies in power, military dictatorships can garner mass popular support for shorter or longer periods if they are seen to resist (however mildly) neocolonial domination. The recent examples (early 2020s) of proto-nationalist military coups in Francophone West Africa (Guinea, Mali, Burkina Faso and Niger) are cases in point. This book develops theoretical arguments that redirect intellectual thought away from Euro-American liberal conceptions as well as from neo-nativist fashions and vulgar Marxisms, so as to reassert the importance of latent 'African potentials' that are frequently embodied in collective popular statements for rethinking, dialectically, a true politics of emancipation on the African continent.
