THE DECISION TO ADOPT A EUROPEAN LANGUAGE AS AN OFFICIAL LANGUAGE IS A COMMON POST-COLONIAL STRATEGY IN WEST AFRICA, INTENDED TO UNIFY DIVERSE POPULATIONS AND CONNECT TO GLOBAL ECONOMIC SYSTEMS.

HOWEVER, THE DEGREE TO WHICH INDIGENOUS LANGUAGES ARE INTEGRATED INTO OFFICIAL FUNCTIONS VARIES SIGNIFICANTLY ACROSS THE REGION, INFLUENCING NATIONAL IDENTITY AND SOCIAL COHESION.
