UNDERSTANDING THE AGE OF EXTREMES: THE SHORT 20TH CENTURY

HISTORICAL MATERIALISM AND IDEOLOGICAL CRITIQUE

HOBBSBAWM'S APPLICATION OF HISTORICAL MATERIALISM PROVIDES A CRITICAL FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERSTANDING THE CENTURY'S EXTREMES. SOME SCHOLARS ARGUE THAT HIS MARXIST LENS SOMETIMES LEADS TO SELECTIVE EMPHASIS, PARTICULARLY IN HIS EVALUATIONS OF SOVIET COMMUNISM AND WESTERN CAPITALISM. CRITICS HAVE POINTED OUT THAT HOBSBAWM'S SYMPATHY TOWARDS LEFTIST MOVEMENTS OCCASIONALLY DOWNPLAYS AUTHORITARIAN EXCESSES OR HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES.

OTHERS HAVE NOTED THAT THE BOOK'S BROAD SCOPE SOMETIMES SACRIFICES DEPTH, ESPECIALLY IN COMPLEX REGIONAL HISTORIES. FOR EXAMPLE, THE NUANCED REALITIES OF POSTCOLONIAL STATES OR THE DIVERSITY OF COLD WAR EXPERIENCES ACROSS DIFFERENT COUNTRIES RECEIVE LESS DETAILED ATTENTION. THESE CRITIQUES SUGGEST THAT WHILE THE AGE OF EXTREMES IS A MONUMENTAL SYNTHESIS, IT MAY REQUIRE SUPPLEMENTATION WITH MORE SPECIALIZED STUDIES FOR COMPREHENSIVE UNDERSTANDING.
