RECOGNIZING RADICALS IS A CRUCIAL TIP FOR ANYONE EMBRACING THE CHINESE CHARACTER OF THE DAY, AS IT HELPS LEARNERS MAKE EDUCATED GUESSES ABOUT UNFAMILIAR CHARACTERS AND IMPROVES MEMORIZATION.

STROKE ORDER AND STROKE COUNT
