OPENING OF THE TOKYO METRO IN 1927

DIRK BOGARDE (1921-1999) – BRITISH ACTOR AND NOVELIST

EDMUND SPENSER (1552-1599)

RUDOLF DIESEL'S PATENT GRANTED IN 1892

ON SEPTEMBER 28, 1892, RUDOLF DIESEL WAS GRANTED A PATENT FOR HIS REVOLUTIONARY ENGINE DESIGN. THE DIESEL

ENGINE WOULD GO ON TO TRANSFORM INDUSTRIES BY PROVIDING A MORE EFFICIENT POWER SOURCE FOR TRANSPORTATION AND MACHINERY. THIS INVENTION NOT ONLY BOOSTED INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTIVITY BUT ALSO PAVED THE WAY FOR FUTURE ADVANCES IN ENGINE TECHNOLOGY.

ADVANCES IN MEDICAL RESEARCH

THROUGHOUT HISTORY, SEPTEMBER 28TH HAS MARKED IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENTS AND BREAKTHROUGHS IN MEDICAL SCIENCE.
