WHEN YOU TEACH IN SIGN LANGUAGE, YOU'RE DOING MORE THAN IMPARTING VOCABULARY AND GRAMMAR—YOU'RE HELPING TO PRESERVE CULTURE, SUPPORT IDENTITY, AND PROMOTE INCLUSIVITY. SIGN LANGUAGE TEACHING BREAKS DOWN COMMUNICATION BARRIERS AND BUILDS BRIDGES BETWEEN HEARING AND DEAF INDIVIDUALS.
